Parking Survey Results, Parking Renewal and VPP

The summary of the parking survey, all comments and data analysis can be found on the parking page of the Ridgely's Delight website (http://www.ridgelysdelight.org/parking.php). After evaluating the results, the RDA board determined that there was not strong enough support of any one survey issue to move forward with a parking petition. In addition, the upcoming Virtual Permit Parking (VPP) pilot program should be evaluated before further changes are made.

Join CSA at the Pigtown Farmer's Market


