Community Meeting on April 1st

Our community meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 1st, at 7pm, upstairs at Sliders. Jennifer Kunze from Chesapeake Climate Action Network will be in attendance to discuss the possibility of freight trains carrying crude oil through Baltimore.

Plant Your Free Stoop Garden

Thanks to a grant from the Parks & People Foundation, the Association will host a greening event on May 9th at 9am in the Burgundy lot to help neighbors create their own stoop gardens. We will offer free native Maryland plants and Leaf Guard soil, plus use of our community gardening tools. Just bring your green thumb and containers.

Street Sweeping Is HERE

You've heard it on the RDA website, social media pages and email that street sweeping is coming. Well, it's finally here! Street sweeping signs were installed in March, and the program has begun in our neighborhood. Parking is prohibited:

- from 8am to noon on the odd side of the street on the third Wednesday of the month
- from 8am to noon on the even side of the street on the fourth Wednesday of the month

The "no ticketing" grace period has passed. You WILL receive a ticket from the City unless your car is moved from the requested side of the street between 8am and noon on the appropriate days.

The dates, times and sides of the street affected by street sweeping are posted on the calendar at ridgelysdelight.org. If you have an electronic calendar that is compatible with Google, you can copy the events into it as a reminder.

With the newly introduced street sweeping signs, the City also installed new signs that prohibit parking at the end of the block at any time. Please be watchful of the new postings.

Ridgely's Pirates Sailing August 7th

Due to the rip-roaring good time we had on last year's Urban Pirates cruise, we're going to take to the high seas – or at least the Chesapeake – again this year. Please join your neighbors on Friday, August 7th for an hour-long, all-Ridgely's Urban Pirates grog cruise and help us pillage the Inner Harbor. Boarding on the pier at Ann and Thames Sts. begins at 7pm. The ship sails from 7:30-8:30pm. Bring your own grog on the 52-foot ship Fearless and enjoy maritime songs, dancing and debauchery. Feel free to dress in pirate gear to get in the mood.

Tickets will be available for \$25 apiece – cash or check accepted – at the community meeting and first Friday happy hour. You can also contact admin@ridgelysdelight.org. A maximum of 49 passengers are admitted on each cruise, so don't delay. Please note that we have purchased all the tickets for this cruise, so you can't buy them with a Groupon or through Urban Pirates.

Grog cruises are for adults aged 21 and older, and you must provide photo ID to board. Drinks are not sold on board, so bring any adult beverages and mixers that you wish in glass, plastic and cans. Coolers are allowed.

If you can't wait until summer to get your pirate on, you can go to the Privateer Festival April 18th-19th in Fells Point.

Fighting crude oil-by-rail in Baltimore*

The Chesapeake Climate Action Network (CCAN) is the first grassroots, nonprofit organization dedicated exclusively to fighting global warming in Maryland, Virginia, and Washington, D.C. Through litigation, CCAN has helped reduce mercury pollution from a coal plant in Wise County (Virginia) and force the cleanup of three coal ash dump sites in Maryland.

CCAN would like to alert Marylanders that Targa Terminals, located in South Baltimore, recently applied for a construction permit to expand and retrofit its existing export pier to store, handle, process and ship more than nine million barrels of crude oil per year to East Coast refineries. The oil industry is targeting Baltimore as an easy through-way to export crude oil. CCAN and others believe a crude oil train or port explosion could threaten thousands of Baltimore residents, local property and the environment. The goal of CCAN is to spread the news about the possibility of Targa Resources transporting crude oil by rail through Baltimore.


