Holiday Closings

City Offices will be closed Friday January 1st in observance of New Year's Day and January 19th in observance of Martin Luther King's birthday.

**Since New Year's Day fall on a Friday and the City offices are closed, there will be NO recycling pick-up. Instead, recycling pick-up will be on Saturday, January 2nd.

Ridgely's Alley Clean-up on January 9th

Multiple neighbors have suggested a clean-up focused on the neighborhood alleyways. Unkempt alleyways may be inviting burglars and rats. If you have an interest in curbing the increasing rat population around the 600 block of Dover Street, James Wolf (jameswolf@gmail.com) will be there to lead a focused clean-up effort. Please feel free to contact James if you are interested in helping in that area or please get together with your neighbors to help clean an alleyway close to your home.

Curbside Leaf Collection ends Jan. 4th

DPW's Bureau of Solid Waste has collected bagged leaves curbside, on Mondays, with an appointment, since mid-October. To take advantage of the January 4th bagged leaf collection, residents must make an appointment to have them picked up by calling **311 before 6 pm on Sunday, January 3rd**. With an appointment, up to twenty (20) bags of leaves will be collected.

However, DPW will continue to collect bagged leaves weekly on the regularly scheduled trash collection day. Solid Waste crews will collect up to 5 bags of leaves from each address every week. Residents need to put leaves in clear or labeled bags and place them at their regular mixed refuse collection location and not in the public right-of-way.

In addition, residents can also drop off bagged leaves at one of the five Citizen Convenience locations, Mon.-Sat. from 9am-5pm:

1. Quarantine Road Sanitary Landfill located at 6100 Quarantine Road
2. Western Citizens' Convenience Center located at 701 Reedbird Avenue
3. Eastern Citizens' Convenience Center located at 6101 Bowleys Lane
4. Northwest Citizens' Convenience Center located at 2840 Sisson Street
5. Northwest Transfer Station located at 5030 Reisterstown Road (open Mon.-Sat. 7am-3pm)

Parking Petition

A parking petition to change the current parking rules in the neighborhood is currently in the hands of the Ridgely's Delight Association. Signing the petition would mean you are in support of a change to the current rules. Basically, the change would be for the 2 hour parking grace period for any non-permitted cars to be shortened from the current 8am-midnight window to an 8am-6pm window and permits (including visitor's passes) would be required in ALL cars from the hours of 6pm to 8am.

Therefore, a change would mean only permitted cars (ie, #5 parking sticker or visitor's pass) would be allowed to park in the neighborhood starting from 6pm and throughout the night until 8am. This change would also prevent any non-permitted cars from parking overnight in the neighborhood from midnight until 8am as there are currently no parking regulations in effect during that time period

If you support the change to shrink the window of allowable hours for 2-hour non-permit parking and have permit parking only from 6pm to 8am, please sign the petition.

If you do not support the change and want the allowable hours for 2-hour non-permitted parking from 8am-midnight to remain as is and the unrestricted parking overnight (no permits necessary), do not sign the petition.

No matter whether you support or do not support a change, sign or do not sign the petition, there will NOT be any change to the current rules of requiring a parking pass or visitor's pass during stadium events.

If you are interested in signing, you only have until February 11th. There are multiple ways for you to sign the petition.

1. At the January and February monthly community meetings
2. Volunteers will be going door to door to for signatures
3. Contact president@ridgelysdelight for an appointment.

If 60% or more of the neighborhood signs the petition, the Parking Authority will continue to the next step and contact all of the petition signers to verify that they have signed. Then the decision process will continue in City government.

The petition will clearly state the restriction changes and the hours for which they are to take effect. The important thing to remember is that you should only sign the petition if you support the change in parking restriction hours. If you do not support it, do not sign the petition.

Only one person from each household will be counted. All residents, including renters, are eligible to participate in the petition. Per the Parking Authority's rules, only residents may participate. If you own property in the neighborhood but do not live in that property, you are not eligible to sign.

DPW will offer curbside collection of trees from Tuesday, December 29th through Friday, January 29th. Residents should set out trees on their regularly scheduled trash collection day at the same location where their trash is collected.

Tree Mulching

Tree mulching for Baltimore City residents starts Saturday, January 2nd and continues through January 30th. Mulching services will be offered from Monday through Saturday, 9am-2pm. at the Reedbird Citizen Convenience Center, 701 Reedbird Avenue.

Trees must be free of tinsel, decorations, nails, or any other foreign material. Residents may bring their own bags or containers if they wish to collect mulch for their own use.

Citizens are encouraged to continue to recycle wrapping paper and recyclable packaging from gifts. For more information about recycling please call 311 or visit publicworks.baltimorecity.gov
