
Sewage Backups Due to Rain

Citizens who experience basement sewage backups as

a result of rain events are encouraged to take advantage of the city's Expedited Reimbursement Program. This program is to reimburse residents and property owners for cleanup costs related to sewage backups caused by wet weather. Application and eligibility information can be found at https://publicworks.baltimorecity.gov/sewer-consent-decree/building-backups. Please note that this program is not designed for costs related to flood damage, hurricanes, or other extreme weather events.
