Conway Park Pergola to Be Dedicated

On Friday evening, April 16, at 6:30 we will dedicate the new pergola in Conway Park in memory of Barney Farnham. A reception will follow the brief ceremony. Everyone in the neighborhood, as well as friends of Barney from elsewhere, are invited to join the festivities.

As rector of Memorial Episcopal Church on Bolton Hill for 29 years, Barney brought vitality, growth, and stability to what had become a dying urban parish. His contributions to the surrounding community and the city beyond were numerous.

As his retirement approached, he and his wife Suzanne purchased a boarded up row house on Paca Street and restored it under the Maryland Historic Trust. They moved in on the first week of February, 1998. Barney quickly gained the admiration, respect, and affection of his neighbors. He was always out and about, greeting people, striking up conversations with adults and children alike, picking up trash from the gutter, taking inventory of streetlights that were out, and reporting problems to the appropriate authorities. He volunteered two days a week at George Washington Elementary in Pigtown and served on the boards of the Ridgely's Delight Association and the Babe Ruth Museum. He was an avid fan of both the Orioles and the Ravens, which is why the bench beneath the pergola faces Camden Yards.

Waste and Receptacle Reminder

Please be aware that it is the law to maintain clean sidewalks and alleys and to only put your trash can out for trash day. Understandably, people may not want to remove their trash receptacle from the front of their house because, in many cases, this would require it to be taken through the house. But it is not only unattractive to see waste receptacles constantly in the fronts of houses, but the smell may prove to be overwhelming as the summer months approach. Please follow the city's guidelines below:

- . Use durable trash cans with tight fitting lids
- Placing trash in bags for collection is illegal and feeds rats
- . No more than 3 (32 gal) cans per address
- Place cans between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. the **evening before** collection
- Don't block alleys and sidewalks with your cans and keep your sidewalks, gutters and alleys trash free
- •Never pile bags on the corner of your block or end of your alley
- •Call 311 for bulk pick up if it doesn't fit in your can it's BULK!
- ·Violations can cost you as much as \$500 per citation
