New Traffic Patterns

Dedicated bus-bike lanes have gone into effect on Lombard and Pratt Streets between Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard and President Street. These specially-striped lanes give priority to bicycles and Charm busses, including the new Citv Circulator. Drivers may also use the lanes for making right turns. Motorists found in violation of the dedicated lanes are subject to a \$90 fine, and the citation may result in points against the driver.

Free Charm City Circulator

The Orange route of the Charm City Circulator, the first of three planned routes for this free inter-Downtown transportation network, was scheduled to begin in January. Buses on the Orange route will run on a loop between Hollins Market and Harbor East, transporting Downtown riders through the BioPark, University of Maryland, City Center, and along the Waterfront. Zero Hour Parking Policy Not Accepted

Parking in the Ridgley's Delight neighborhood can be anything but a delight. There are 427 on street parking spaces, but 441 registered residents. To help alleviate possible parking problems, a zero hour parking policy was proposed as an option for the Ridgley's Delight neighborhood at the January community meeting. Simply stated, zero hour parking would NOT allow anyone without a No.5 permit to park on the neighborhood streets from 6pm-6am. However, two hour parking for those without a permit would continue to be allowed from 6am-6pm. Most resident were very unsatisfied with this proposal. After a vote, there was an overwhelming majority to maintain the current parking restrictions. Many residents were also proponents of a more regular enforcement of the current restrictions. As a result, a Ridgely's Delight Parking Committee, composed of 7 residents, was established to coordinate with Baltimore City's Residential Parking Committee in hopes to address neighborhood parking problems and target flaws in the Parking Authority's enforcement division.

Voting Eligibility

In order for a resident to be eligible to vote on community issues, he/she must be a "member in good standing" as stated in the by-laws of the Ridgely's Delight Community Association. To remain a member in good standing, "a member must be at least eighteen (18) years of age and must have attended two (2) regular or board meetings or previously sanctioned community events within four (4) months prior to the meeting at which the vote will be cast." Examples of community sanctioned events are neighborhood cleanups or any specific neighborhood improvement project such as pergola construction, fence construction, and plantings.

It is therefore imperative that residents sign the attendance sheet at each event. Every effort will be made to ensure accurate attendance records, and event attendance will be listed on the Ridgley's Delight yahoo group website within a few days of each event. Residents are encouraged to check these lists to verify their names are included if they attended the event.
