Burglaries in Ridgely's Delight

There have been six home burglaries in the neighborhood during October. At least some of the crimes occurred during daylight hours and involved forced entry from the front of the home. Three occurred in the 600 block of Portland, two in the 200 block of S. Fremont and one in the 400 block of S. Fremont. All residents, particularly those in the northern part of the community, should keep alert for suspicious activity and call the police at 911 if anything unusual is observed.

Take a few minutes to do a home security check. The idea is to make your house look occupied. On the inside, doors should fit tightly in the frame and have a secure, one inch deadbolt lock. Put some lights and a radio on a timer. Update you home inventory listing things like computers, sports equipment and electronics. Secure sliding doors with a commercially available lock or a wooden dowel in the track.

On the outside, make sure front and back entrances are well lit. Consider installing a motion detector in the back. Keep your home well maintained and store tools, ladders, and such inside when not in use. Please also report broken street lights, abandoned cars, graffiti, and litter to 311. Helping the neighborhood stay in good shape can also deter crime.


