Winter Tips: Water Meters and Corners

When you turn on your water and nothing flows, it is often because the water meter is frozen in front of your house. The black plate on your sidewalk is the water meter and often, there are two meters mounted on the underside of the plate, one for you, and one for your neighbor. As a preventative measure, please clear the snow from the sidewalk especially where the plate is, and continue across the sidewalk in a straight line to the curb and about a foot into the street. Of course, you should also clear the snow from above the meter to the wall and foundation of your home. We can also improve walkability and safety by keeping curb cuts clear on the corners for pedestrians.
