Christmas Tree Removal

Residents have two options for disposing of their Christmas trees. You can set your tree out on the curb where your trash is collected every Wednesday from January 9 through January 31 and it will be collected. The Department of Public Works will not pick up the tree *after* January 31, so please don't miss the last date. All tinsel and decorations must be removed.

If you want to recycle your tree for free mulch, bring it to the Northwest Citizens' Convenience Center at 2840 Sisson St. from January 6-31, Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Residents should bring bags or containers to collect the mulch for their use.

Wrapping paper and gift boxes can be included in your recycle bin every Friday.
